## Goals

C1	The aim of this course is to familiarize students with the premises and challenges of European integration. Students will learn about the history, institutions, and policies of the EU, and understand the political dynamics and public opinion surrounding EU integration. In addition to learning about the politics of European integration and the workings of the European system, students will learn to think like social science researchers, applying political science theories to the study of European politics. Students will gain familiarity with the types of questions and topics addressed by political science with respect to EU integration. Students are expected to learn skills including the ability to read and comprehend political science texts quickly, extracting key points of information from them.
